THE RULES

This is an open show; all entries are welcome. There is no entry fee.

All varieties in an entry should be named, if possible.

Entries must have been the property of the Exhibitor for at least 1 month prior to the show except for potted plants, which must have been the property of the Exhibitor for at least 3 months prior to the show.

Any Exhibitor staging on Saturday must submit class list to the Chief Show Chair, brycefradley@icloud.com by 6:00 pm on Thursday July 9.

All exhibitors participating in the **Decorative Section** must notify the Chief Show Chair Bryce Fradley of their class and number of exhibits by 6:00 pm on Thursday July 9 at brycefradley@icloud.com.

Containers will be provided and must be used for all classes except where otherwise stated in the catalogue.

All exhibits in the Junior Section must be arranged by the Exhibitor alone. Juniors are children 15 years or younger.

Provided entries are different cultivars, Exhibitors may make more than one entry per class, save in the Junior Section.

Any exhibit may be removed at the discretion of the Show Officials.

Exhibitors must not remove exhibits before 4:00 pm Saturday, July 11.

All exhibits are shown at the Exhibitor's risk. The Show Organizers are not responsible for loss or damage.

Any decision of the Judges is final.

STAGING YOUR EXHIBITS

Exhibits may be staged on Friday July 10 between 2:00 pm and 8:00 pm, and on Saturday July 11 from 7:00 am to 7:30 am by appointment only. Any Exhibitor staging on Saturday must submit their class list to the Chief Show Chair at brycefradley@icloud.com by 6:00 pm on Thursday July 9.

All exhibitors participating in the **Decorative Section** must notify the Chief Show Chair Bryce Fradley of their class and number of exhibits by 6:00 pm on Thursday July 9 at brycefradley@icloud.com.

Entry cards will be available during the staging hours and online at victorialilysociety.ca/services. No pre-registration is necessary.

When the type of container is not specified, the Exhibitor must use the container supplied by the Victoria Lily Society. This includes collections.

All entries must be in one container unless otherwise stated.

Please name your exhibits wherever possible.

Your entries are subject to the rules in this catalogue, including all time parameters.

Please read the rules carefully. If you have questions, contact the Show Chairs as soon as possible for clarification.

DEFINITIONS

Basket: must have a looped handle by which it may be lifted.

Bowl: a receptacle, the diameter of the mouth of which is greater than the height.

Bud, flower: two petals beginning to unfurl with the sepals down, about one quarter open.

Cultivar: Term for what is commonly known by horticulturists as a 'cultivated variety', or simply a 'variety', e.g. rose 'Peace'.

Disbudded: side buds removed.

NAS: not according to schedule.

Vase: a receptacle, the height of which is greater than the diameter.

JUDGING

Judging is done by experienced horticultural judges.

Judging will begin at 8:00 am on Saturday, July 11, 2026.

Judges are to withhold any or all prizes where the quality of the exhibits is not considered worthy of an award. Judges may award 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and honourable mention prizes with as many as the quality of exhibits in a class warrants.

All prize-winning exhibits will be acknowledged. Rosettes will be awarded for the best exhibit in each Division and Section.

ROSE SECTION

Only one container to be used unless otherwise specified.

All roses should be named.

Division D - Specimen Bloom (disbudded)

32. One Hybrid Tea, red
33. One Hybrid Tea, white, or near white
34. One Hybrid Tea, yellow or yellow blend (Peace should be exhibited in this class)
35. One Hybrid Tea, pink or pink blend, or blends of these colours
36. One Hybrid Tea, orange or apricot, or blends of these colours
37. One Hybrid Tea, any other colour (i.e. mauve, russet, or red blend)
38. One Floribunda, any colour (one stem, one bloom)
39. One Grandiflora, any colour (one stem, one bloom)
40. One shrub (including David Austin) (one stem, one bloom)

Division E - Sprays, at least two blooms open, any colour

41. One spray, Hybrid Tea
42. One spray, Floribunda or Polyantha
43. One spray, Grandiflora
44. One spray, Miniature
45. One spray, David Austin English Rose
46. One spray, Shrub (other than David Austin)
47. One spray, Climber or rambler, or climbing versions of Hybrid Tea or Floribunda
48. One spray, Old Garden Rose (permissible to show O.G.R. sprays with just one bloom open and buds)

Division F - Miscellaneous Roses

49. Cycle of Bloom, 3 stems of one cultivar, one bud showing colour, one bloom at exhibition state, one full bloom (stamens may show), in one container
50. Any bloom, in a brandy snifter (judged for fragrance, use your own container)
51. Miniature, 1 bloom, afloat in a wine glass (use your own container)
52. Bowl of Miniatures or mini floral (use your own container)
53. Bowl of Roses, any type / types (use your own container)

MISCELLANEOUS FLOWER SECTION

Division G - Cut Flowers

54. Begonia, double, bloom displayed floating on foliage
55. Bulbs, 3 stems, summer bulb other than lily
56. Calla Lily, 2 stems, 1 or 2 leaves permitted
57. Delphinium, 1 spike
58. Dianthus, 3 stems
59. Euphorbia, 1 to 3 cuts
60. Hosta, 3 leaves
61. Lupin, 1 stem
62. Peony, 1 stem
63. Phlox, 3 stems
64. Shasta Daisy, 1 cultivar, 3 stems
65. Sweet Peas, 6 stems, one colour
66. Sweet Peas, 12 stems, mixed colours
67. Any other annual flower not listed, 3 stems same kind, 1 container
68. Any other perennial flower not listed, 3 stems same kind, 1 container
69. Grass, 1 cultivar, 3 stems (no seed heads)
70. Ornamental seed head or branch/head of berries

Division H - Shrubs, Vines, Collections, Bowls, Baskets

Judges may subdivide classes as needed

71. Clematis, any size, 1 cut
72. Any other vine, 1 cut
73. Collection, perennial flowers, 5 kinds, 1 or 2 cuts, own foliage, balanced, pleasing to the eye
74. Collection, annuals, 5 kinds, 1 or 2 cuts each, own foliage, balanced, pleasing to the eye
75. Collection, decorative foliage, 5 kinds, 1 to 3 cuts, balanced, pleasing to the eye
76. Collection of culinary herbs, 5 or more kinds, 1 to 3 cuts, fresh, named, one container, balanced, pleasing to the eye
77. Collection of medicinal herbs, 5 or more kinds, 1 to 3 cuts, fresh, named, one container, balanced, pleasing to the eye
78. Decorative foliage, non-woody plant, 1 to 5 cuts
79. Decorative foliage, woody plant, 1 to 3 cuts
80. Flowering shrub or tree, 1 cut / branch / stem / truss
81. Fragrant foliage, 1 branch
82. Bowl (any size), one type of flower, any fresh foliage
83. Bowl (any size), mixed flowers, any fresh foliage
84. Basket of flowers, mixed flowers, any fresh foliage, not to exceed 24" in any direction
85. Bowl (any size) fresh foliage, flower buds permitted

POTTED PLANT SECTION

Division I - Potted Plant

86. Fuchsia, any type, 1 plant
87. Fuchsia, any type, 3 plants
88. Bonsai, 1 plant
89. Cactus or Succulent, including sedum and crassulas, 1 plant
90. Cacti or Succulent container, including sedum and crassulas, one or more kinds
91. Pelargonium, zonal types (including stellars, rosebuds, and fancy leaf types), 1 plant
92. Pelargonium scented leaf types and species, 1 plant
93. Pelargonium Angel and Regal, plant
94. Pelargonium trained (standards columns, fans etc.), 1 plant
95. Scented plant, any other variety, 1 plant
96. Flowering plant, any other variety, 1 plant
97. Outdoor foliage plant, any other variety, no blooms allowed
98. Tub or large pot of herbs for patio
99. Tub or large pot, 1 or more types of plants
100. House plant foliage only, no blooms allowed
101. House plant flowering, must have some colour on buds
102. Mixed outdoor planter
103. Miniature garden or trough
104. Any other plant, pruned to a standard
